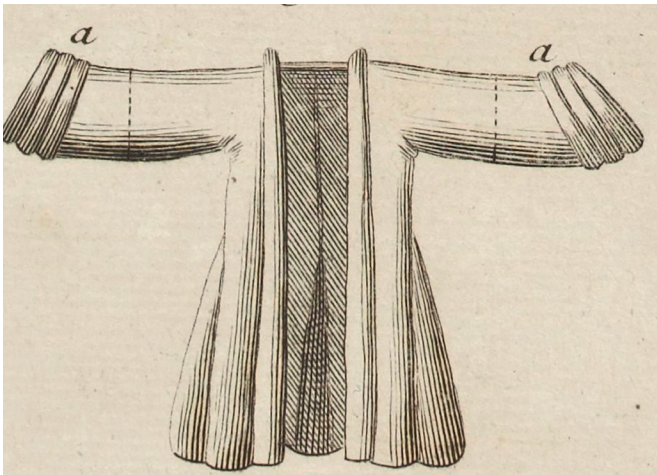

A 'PATTERNS OF FASHION 6' WEEKEND - 28th & 29th MAY

THE CUT & CONSTRUCTION OF WOMEN'S 18th CENTURY FLAT-CUT BEDGOWNS & MANTUAS

1-Day Course - 28th May from 10am to 6pm



Using a cut and construction sequence published in the late 18th century from an interview with the Court mantua-maker to the Princesse de Carignan this class will explore the making of patterns by the method of folding a length of textile, diagrams of which are included in the introduction of our new book. Students will make a half-scale garment from the instructions.

THE SHAPING OF 18th CENTURY WOMEN'S GOWNS WITH DARTS AND PLEATS

1-Day Course - 29th May from 10am to 6pm

Darts and pleats were used extensively throughout the 18th century by both those makers with dressmaking and tailoring skills to give the desired shape over underpinnings such as stays, hoops and rumps. This class will explore the ways these features were used as the dress styles changed over the time period. Several extant garments in the School collection will be available for study in the classroom and students will make silk samples of the techniques used.

THE CUT & CONSTRUCTION OF 18th CENTURY SACKS

1-Day Course - 4th June from 10am to 6pm

Using a cut and construction sequence for a sack published in the late 18th century from an interview with Court mantua-maker to ... this class will explore the methods described in the translation of this French text included in the introduction of our new book. Students will have the opportunity to study the example from our School collection shown here and to make a half-scale sample of a sack.

THE CUT & CONSTRUCTION OF 18th CENTURY FLAT-CUT PETTICOATS & TABLIERS

1-Day Course - 5th June from 10am to 6pm

Using extant petticoats from our School collection and a reconstruction of a tablier, this class will explore the ways in which these garments were made for use with a variety of dresses, together with the ways in which a frugal amount of fabric could be used.

A tablier (the French word for apron) were open petticoats, of which there are three examples shown in 'Patterns of Fashion 6'.

Students will make a half-scale tablier in silk during the course.

WOMEN'S 18TH CENTURY GARMENTS THAT RELATE TO THOSE IN JANET ARNOLD'S *PATTERNS OF FASHION 1*

2-hour Course - 11th June from 10am to 6pm

Using extant garments in our collection c.1740–85, including a silk caraco, triple-layered striped muslin sleeve ruffles, a yellow silk taffeta bodice and petticoat, this 2-hour class will introduce students to the content, cut, construction and context of garments similar to those featured with scale patterns in 'Patterns of Fashion 1'.

WOMEN'S 18TH CENTURY GARMENTS THAT RELATE TO THOSE IN JANET ARNOLD'S *'PATTERNS OF FASHION 5'*

2-hour Course - 12th June from 10am to 6pm

Using extant garments in our collection c.1750–1785, including a silver tissue petticoat, a pair of silver tissue smooth-covered Court stays, and the reconstruction of a wide hoop c.1740–50, this class will introduce students to the content, cut, construction and context of garments similar to those featured with scale patterns in 'Patterns of Fashion 5'.

A 'PATTERNS OF FASHION 5' WEEKEND - 18th & 19th JUNE



STITCHED & SMOOTH-COVERED BODIES & STAYS c.1600-1700

1-Day Course - 18th June from 10am to 6pm

Using extant and reconstructed bodies in the classroom this course will introduce students to the difference in cut and construction between stitched and smooth covered bodies and stays.

Samplers will be worked in modern versions of period appropriate materials.

THE DEVELOPMENT OF FARTHINGALES c.1550-1700

1-Day Course - 19th June from 10am to 6pm

Using reconstructed farthingales in the classroom this course will introduce students to the materials, cut and construction of farthingales that later developed in to 18th century hoops. These structured petticoats were stiffened with a variety of applied hoops which gave the outer petticoat or the skirt of a gown a stable support.

Samplers will be worked in modern versions of period appropriate materials.

A 'PATTERNS OF FASHION 6' WEEKEND - 25th & 26th JUNE



18th CENTURY STOMACHER DECORATION

1-Day Course - 25th June from 10am to 6pm

The small scale of these garments meant that they were often richly embellished. The stomachers in the School's and the Hopkins Collection, several of which are surveyed in 'Patterns of Fashion 6', will be studied during the class, and small samples of the varied embroidery techniques worked.

18th CENTURY QUILTED CLOTHING

1-Day Course - 26th June from 10am to 6pm

Quilted garments were usually practical, providing extra layers for warmth, but were often also decorative. Original pieces from the School's collection will be studied, and students will produce samples of the varied types of quilting seen on 18th century garments such as petticoats, bedgowns (or short gowns) and waistcoats.
